Some of those who had been eligible for the mandatory consecutive sentences based on the use of a firearm in a crime of violence will no longer be. There is a real likelihood, too, that *Johnson* will similarly affect the Sentencing Guideline definition of “crime of violence,” which would mean far fewer would be eligible for sentencing as career offenders and that some of those sentenced under the provision applicable to firearms immigration will benefit.
